

PATMOS LIBRARY  
RESOLUTION TO DENY APPEAL OF RECONSIDERATION REQUEST  
REGARDING THE BREAKAWAYS

At a meeting of the Library Board of the Patmos Library held in the Library on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of October, 2022, at 6:30 p.m., prevailing Eastern Time.

The following resolution was offered by Member Marcia Frobish and supported by Member Angela Rodenhouse

WHEREAS, the Patmos Library was established under the provisions of the City, Village and Township Libraries Act, 1877 PA 164 (“PA 164”);

WHEREAS, pursuant to PA 164, the Board is authorized to enact policies governing the use of the Library and has adopted a Material Selection Policy;

WHEREAS, pursuant to terms of the Policy, a requester filed a Request for Reconsideration for “The Breakaways”;

WHEREAS, the basis for reconsideration was stated as follows: “I believe there is was an agenda to promote revere racism and teaches critical race theory which is not acceptable to all people. There is an inappropriate sleepover depicted (153-159); an inappropriate storyline (193-195); inappropriate propaganda displayed (186-187). Further, the requester does not think that this material should be available without parental supervision.” The request attached as Exhibit 1 provides the full explanation for the basis for reconsideration;

WHEREAS, pursuant to that policy, the requester filed an appeal with the Patmos Library Board (“Library Board”). The appeal request is attached as Exhibit 2 to this Resolution;

WHEREAS, the Library Board met on October 3, 2022, to consider the appeal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS: the Library Board of Patmos Library has determined it is in the best interest of the Library to deny the appeal to remove “The Breakaways” (“Book”) from the Library Collection for the following reasons:

1. Under the United States Constitution, the law recognizes a First Amendment “right to receive information” from a public library. *Kreimer v. Bureau of Police*, 958 F.2d 1242, 1255 (3d Cir.1992). A decision to remove a book from the Library impacts that “right to receive information” because patrons will no longer have access to the Book at the Library.
2. This request for reconsideration asks for the Library Board to censor information that would otherwise be available to other patrons because of the content and subject matter of the Book.

3. The First Amendment right to receive information cannot be denied to other patrons because people may dislike the ideas, content and subject matter contained in the Book.
4. The Book does not violate Michigan or federal law, so patrons who desire to read the book are entitled to First Amendment protection against censorship.
5. In addition to following federal and state laws, the Library has enacted a Material Selection Policy to assist the Library with its mission of education, and with protecting the First Amendment Rights of its patrons.
6. Based on the United States Constitution, federal and Michigan law, and the Library Board's Material Selection and retention policy, the Library Board selection and retention of "Breakaways" is consistent with Library Policy for the following reasons:
  - A. The Library is not in violation of federal or state law by maintaining a copy of the Book in the Library. In fact, the Library is upholding a fundamental right guaranteed by the Constitution.
  - B. Based on the Section V.A of the Policy, the Library has determined that the selection of material should not made based on anticipated approval or disapproval by patrons or Library users, but solely on the merits of a work, without regard to the race, nationality, political or religious view of the writer. Thus, the Library may include books with themes or passages that will not be agreed upon by everyone.
  - C. The Library has determined there are no compelling governmental interests in this instance that would allow it to remove the Book or censor the Book on the basis of its content or the fact that some people disagree with the message.
  - D. Based on Section V.B of the Policy, parents or legal guardians shall be responsible for the selection of materials, and the Library cannot restrict material because one person may find it objectionable or that children can access the Book if their parents chose not to accompany them to the Library. This denies the rights of parents to select the Book for their child.
  - E. The Book meets the Principles for Selection and other standards of the Library's Material Selection Policy:
    - 1) There is contemporary significance and interest in checking out this material. Youth sports are very prevalent today, particularly in this age group. Thus, it also addresses a scarcity of information on this area, particularly different aspects of youth sports.

- 2) The title within the goal of material selection to provide a well-balanced and broad collection of materials and meets the selection criteria to show different points of view.
- 3) The reviews demonstrate that the material portrays issues sensitively and has been described by the School Law Journals as follows: "it's a perfect one for those that are going to school and playing sports."
- 4) For this title, the author received the Book of the Year in Children's/Young Adult 2019 Dorry Award.
- 5) The title has received positive reviews for the Book including the following:
  - a) Kirkus "Groundbreaking - and as complicated as middle school."
  - b) Publisher's Weekly "Using minimal detail, the artwork realistically portrays the characters' relatable emotions and wide-ranging reactions. Her young people also represent a diverse array of sizes, shapes, colors, and notions of attractiveness. Johnson's graphic novel will resonate with readers who are figuring out who they are and where they belong."
  - c) School Library Journal review above.
- 6) The text and drawings are easy to understand.

7. All resolutions that are in conflict with this Resolution are repealed.
